Hello, my fellow Elk members, I need your help:

Back in 2010, I was asked if I would take over the Elks Adopt-A-Troop program of sending boxes to our bases where our soldiers are deployed. This is what started my 15+ year journey with the Adopt-a-Troop program at Hopkins Elks. Since then, I have sent over 5,000+ boxes. We are in a critical situation in the world today and our troops are being shipped out at the rate of thousands of our young US citizens from our hometowns. They are being placed in high alert areas. THESE ARE OUR CHILDREN OR SOMEONE'S CHILDREN WHO WE KNOW. I am shipping to areas where they have nothing. Sometimes I have to send microwaveable food products just so they can set it in the sun so they can eat. Others have to walk a mile to go to the showers on their base thus the need to ship something like flip flops as they walk across the rocks.

I NEED HELP! THEY NEED HELP!! This program is rewarding for both sides, the Elks members, and our soldiers. The soldiers love our support, and we love hearing that the boxes are making them feel happy and that someone across the water thinks about them, cares, and appreciates what they are doing.

I beg each one of you to please look into your heart and soul and help these soldiers with some kind of monetary donation. Maybe you can do so this month? Or one or two or more times? You can drop the donation off to a bartender at the Elks Club in Hopkins and label it Adopt-A-Troop Program. Then I can go to the one dollar and twenty-five cent stores, (still known as "the Dollar Store") to buy items they desperately need.

We normally spend \$500 - \$800 a month at the Dollar Store for all types of items. The Elks Club spends \$22 a box for postage and averages at least 15 – 20 boxes per shipment.

If you have any friends, family members, relatives, etc. who are being shipped overseas or they are already there, I need their information so I can send them these boxes. Contact me via email at <a href="mailto:sguerre@comcast.net">sguerre@comcast.net</a> or text 763-218-7638. I do not ship to US bases where soldiers are in harm's way.

To give you an idea how much it helps the soldiers, here's a sample of some of the letters (there are many more) and pictures from the last 15 years. See the smiles and hear the appreciation in their letters.


