But it was not until 1949 when President Harry Truman, himself a member of the Elks, made the proclamation that thereafter June 14 would be a day of national observance for the symbol of our country. It was through his Elks Lodge in Independence, Missouri, that President Truman got the idea for a national observance of Flag Day.

Our State Convention is the weekend of June 23rd by Rochester Lodge #1091 (not to be confused with the National Convention). We will welcome in our new State President Sue Foster!! They will also be hosting their biggest fundraiser, the Million Dollar Hole-in-One Shoot Out. Rachel De Ville and Amy Lynn Nelson will be inducted as the Minnesota State Organist and Vocalist! Congratulations!


